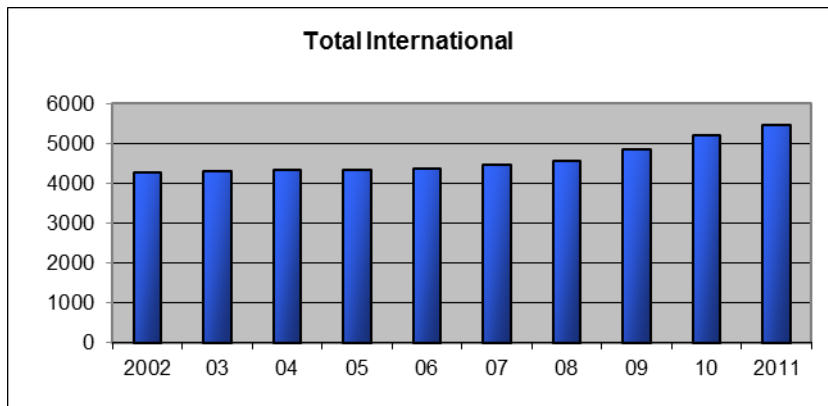

Student Enrollment

According to 2010-11 data from the Institute of International Education (IIE) *Open Doors 2011* report, U-M ranked eighth nationally among all universities (fifth among public research institutions) in terms of “hosting” international students. The *Open Doors* report includes both enrolled students and those on post-completion Optional Practical Training (full-time work authorization after completion of studies). Therefore, *Open Doors 2011* indicates that U-M “hosted” 5,995 international students in Fall Semester, 2010 and not the 5,203 reported as enrolled by the International Center based on Fall Semester 2010 data from the Office of the Registrar. In Fall Semester 2011, U-M enrolled 5,472 international students from 124 countries.

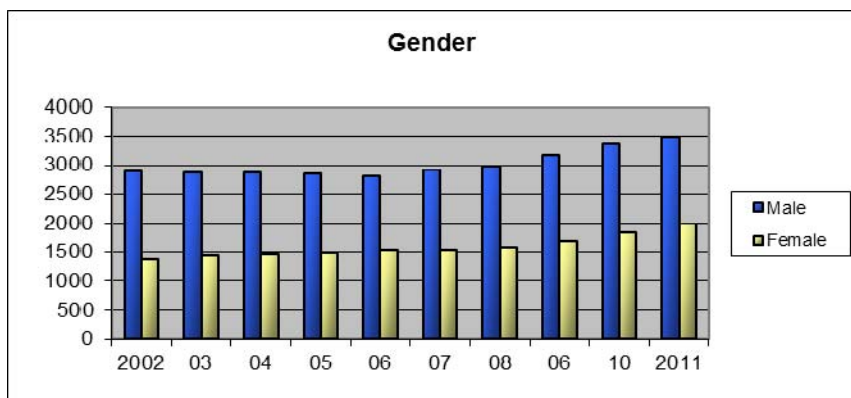


Economic Impact

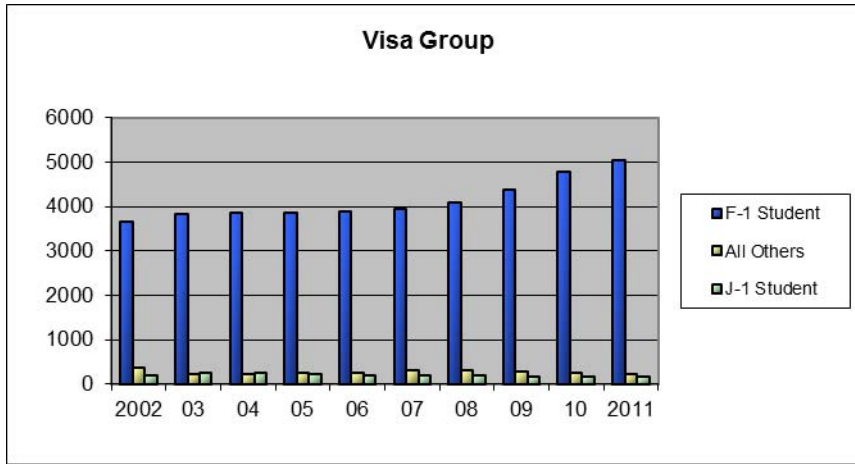

Enrollment by Visa Category

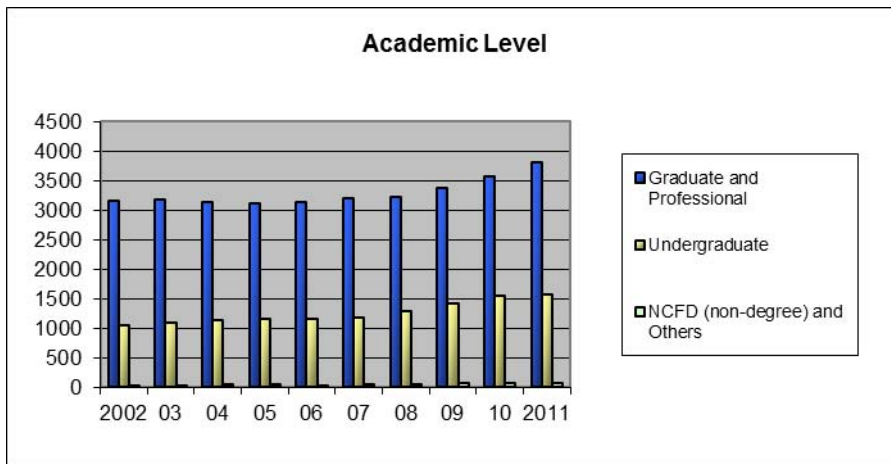

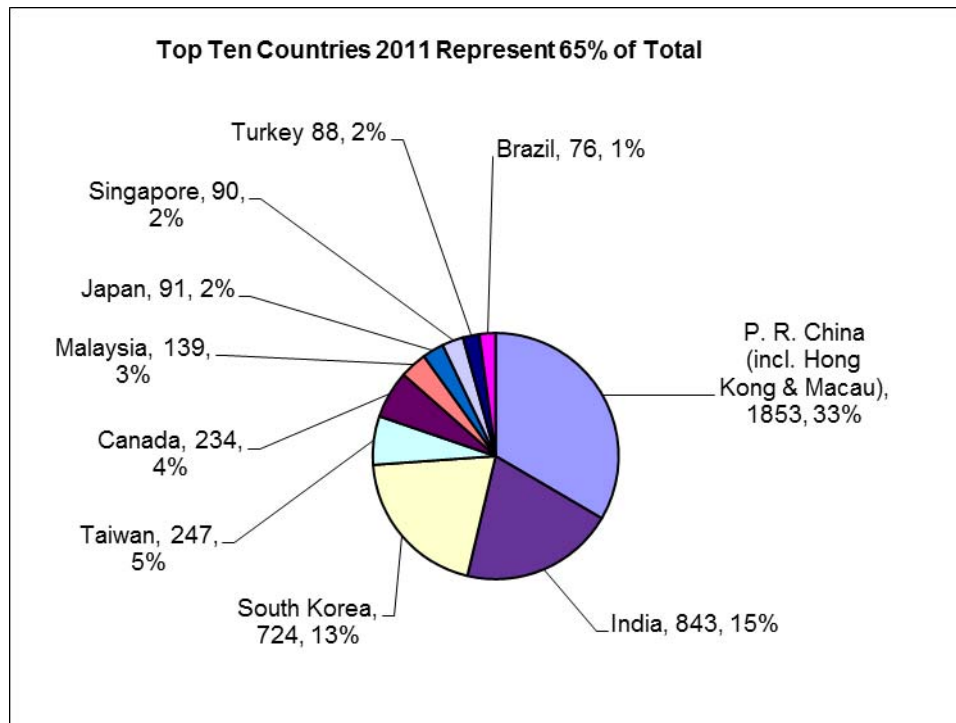

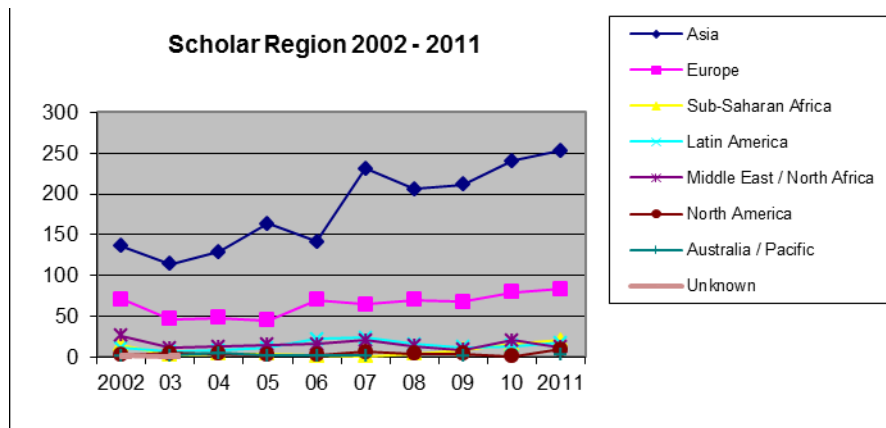

The IC handles all immigration paperwork for those on H-1B and J-1 visas and provides a wide range of services and programs for these individuals and their families. The IC also assists University departments by filing immigrant visa petitions for foreign nationals offered tenure track teaching positions and refers to outside counsel all others who are offered permanent employment at U-M.

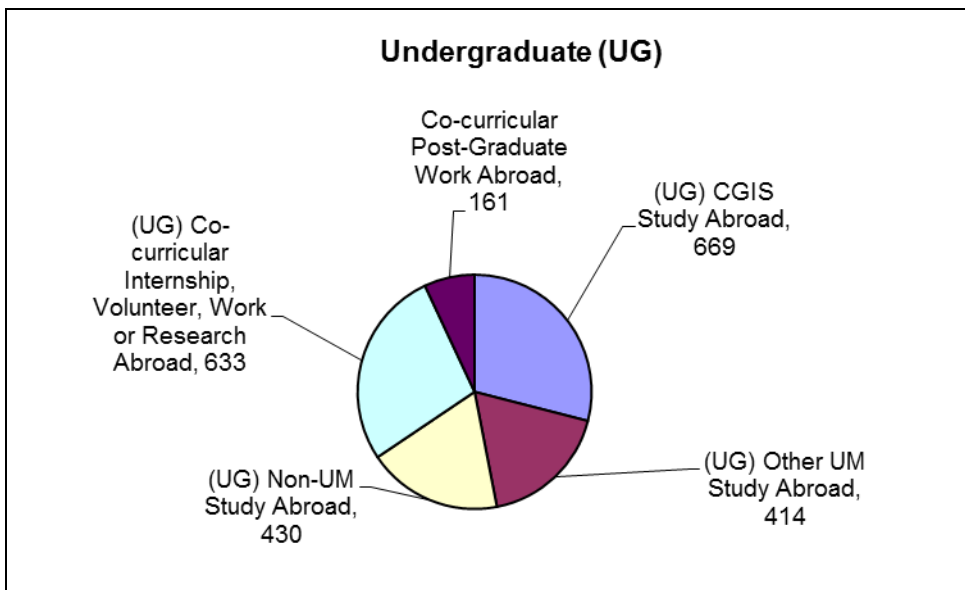

Undergraduate & Post-Graduate Educational Experiences Abroad, 2009-10

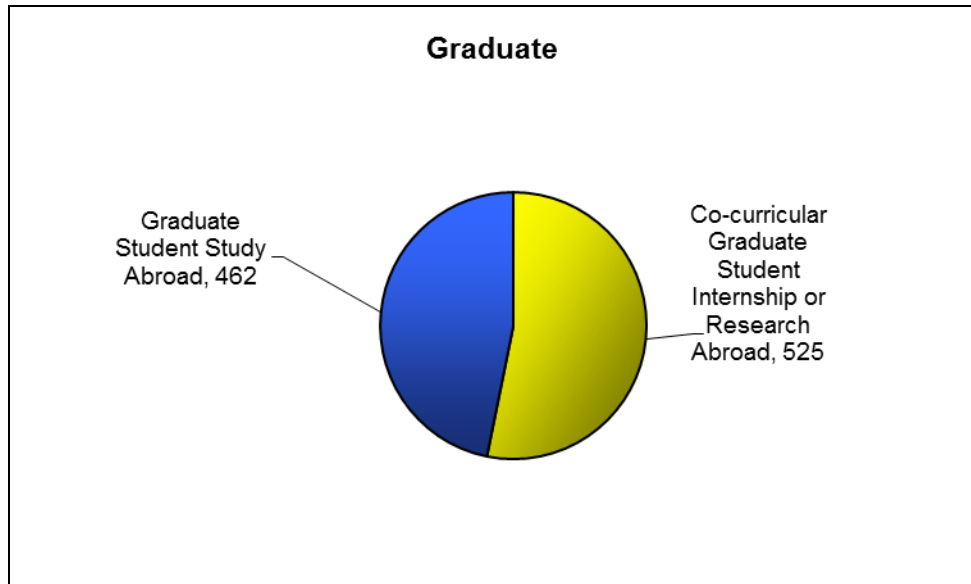
