

## How to Professionally Market Your Volunteer Service: A Training with U-M Head Peace Corps Recruiter Martha Fedorowicz

**Description:** During this training, participants will learn how to put their volunteer and international service experiences into resumes, cover letters, and motivation statements which can be used to apply for jobs in the public and non-profit sectors and for post-graduate service opportunities. Participants will also hear about what it is like to serve in the Peace Corps, how to prepare yourself for international service work as an undergraduate, and things to consider when doing service work when you are an outsider in that community.

Martha Fedorowicz is the Head Campus Recruiter for the Peace Corps at the University of Michigan. She is also a first year Master of Public Policy student at the Ford School of Public Policy. Prior to coming to graduate school, she worked in Chicago as a Program Coordinator at Big Brothers Big Sisters of Metro Chicago and served in the Peace Corps from 2012-2014 where she was a Youth and Community Development Volunteer in Morocco. She has also interned with the State Department at the U.S. Embassy in Paris and interned with a women's political non-profit in Washington D.C. Martha has her Bachelor's degree in Political Science and French with a minor in International Studies from the University of Michigan. While in undergrad she participated in UROP doing education access research on Sub-Saharan Africa, traveled to India on a GIEU service-learning trip, and studied abroad in Aix-en-Provence, France.
